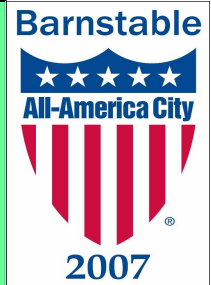

From the Town Manager

Dear Reader,

I would like to extend my thanks to everyone for their calm and patience in dealing with Winter Storm (Blizzard) NEMO. The Governor's call for a travel ban from 4 pm on Friday, February 8th was a prudent one. Chief Paul MacDonald, the head of the Town of Barnstable's Emergency Response Team, reported that there were no injuries or deaths during this storm. A lot of credit goes to those who worked throughout the storm. The Police Department was able to utilize the Marine & Environmental Affairs Division pick up trucks for more reliable transportation. Our Highway Division which was manned 24/7 during the storm worked hard to keep roads passable. Even more impressive was their clean up of business districts on the Monday evening following the storm. We did storm related damage at the Barnstable Senior Center and Sandy Neck Park Beach among other areas. Thanks to the swift action of Senior Services Director Madeline Noonan and the DPW's Structures and Grounds Division, damage at the Senior Center was kept to a minimum. My office has received numerous phone calls regarding the Regional Emergency Sheltering System. I held a staff de-briefing on the Wednesday following NEMO and staff have given thoughtful input as to how we can make improvements during a future event.

I was pleased to accept the Massachusetts Cultural Council's Commonwealth Award as a Creative Community on Tuesday, February 19th at the Statehouse. Also in attendance were Growth Management Director Jo Anne Miller Buntich and Arts & Culture Coordinator Melissa Hersh. In the last year, Barnstable was delighted to receive Cape Cod's first designation as a Cultural District. The Hyannis HyArts Cultural District focuses the Town and its partners on the common goals to attract artists, cultural and creative enterprises; encourage business and job retention and creation; further establish the district as a tourist destination; preserve and reuse historic buildings; enhance property values; and foster local cultural development.

The budgeting process continues. This process actually starts in the early fall, but this is when we finalize our needs. Our Senior Staff has submitted budget requests. We'll keep performing at a high level and continue keeping a close eye on our spending. We will start with the Capital budget in early spring and then move on to the Operating budget.

MARCHing INTO SPRING....

The Town Clerk's office has received the official notification from Gov. Deval Patrick that the Special Primary Election for United States Senator will be held on Tuesday, April 30th from 7 a.m. - 8 p.m. Individuals who are registered voters by April 10th may vote in the election as long as they are a Republican, Democrat or Unenrolled voter. No one who is registered in a party designation may vote. Primary Elections are for party voters and Unenrolled voters ONLY.

The actual Election will be held on June 25, 2013.

Things to remember:

- ✓ Our office is still collecting the census forms, so if you have not turned in your form, it is not too late.
- ✓ Later in March the underground gas storage annual registrations will go out.
- ✓ Last day to register to vote for Primary is April 10th - Town Clerk's office open until 8 p.m.
- ✓ All dogs in town must be registered at all times.

Superintendent's Corner

Barnstable High School: Accreditation - March 3-6, 2013

Each high school in the Commonwealth of Massachusetts can voluntarily participate in the New England Association of Schools and Colleges (NEASC) evaluation process. NEASC is a non-profit regionalized accrediting association that offers programs and services, which monitor school performance and school improvement efforts. The Commission on Public Secondary Schools is one of the six commissions of the association, which evaluates public schools based upon the Commission's seven standards of excellence.

If a school district chooses to participate in this evaluation process, they must conduct a self-study of their high school including programs, services and facilities, must agree to be measured against the seven standards outlined by the Commission, and must host a visiting committee of professionals who will conduct this evaluation. The seven standards are as follows:

1. Core Values, Beliefs and Learning Expectations
2. Curriculum
3. Instruction
4. Assessment of and for Student Learning
5. School Culture and Leadership
6. School Resources for Learning
7. Community Resources for Learning

Barnstable High School is a member of the New England Association of Schools and Colleges and will undergo this evaluation process on March 3-6, 2013. BHS has been preparing for this evaluation during the 2011-2012 school year by completing a self-study of programs, services and facilities. This year-long self-study has included forming committees, gathering feedback from students, staff, parents, and the community, discussing issues and challenges, assessing strengths and needs, and reviewing how the school measures achievement of its learning and expectations.

What Does This Accreditation Mean for Barnstable High School?

The benefits to participating in this accreditation process are several for students, staff and the community. The goal of the accreditation process is to ensure that students who attend Barnstable High School are receiving a quality educational program and the staff at Barnstable High School are continually reflecting upon their practice of teaching and learning and take pride in working in an accreditation public institution. Accreditation of a local public school assures that tax money is supporting a public high school and that programs have been assessed by an independent team of evaluators against a set of standards by NEASC.

On Sunday, March 3, 2013 Mr. Patrick Clark, Principal of Barnstable High School, will welcome the visiting team at 1:00 p.m. in the Knight Auditorium. A panel presentation will take place from 1:00-2:00 p.m. Panel topics will include the following: core values, strengths and needs, examples of student work, and data of our school and community. Teacher, school committee and parent interviews will take place from 2:00 p.m. to 4:15 p.m.

A welcoming reception will take place at 4:15 p.m. in the Knight Auditorium Lobby.

On Monday, March 4th through Wednesday, March 6th, the visiting team will be observing classrooms, meeting with students, staff, central office administration, school committee, parents and community members. At the conclusion of the team's visit on Wednesday, March 6th, the committee will vote and discuss the school's accreditation. Closing remarks will be given to the school community by the Visiting Committee Chair. A formal written report of the visit will be provided to the Superintendent of Schools and the Barnstable High School Principal.

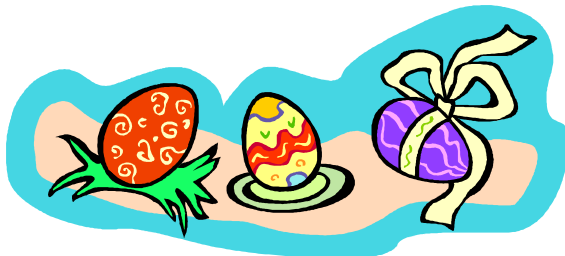

On display at Barnstable Town Hall now through April 12th The works of Barnstable High School art students in the Hearing Room and Selectmen's Conference Rooms, 2nd floor

The "Art on Loan" program which displays the work of local artists on the meeting room walls in Barnstable Town Hall, will feature the art work of Barnstable High School Art Students from the art classes of Carl Lopes. Carl Lopes is both an art educator and studio artist. He is the Visual Arts Director for Barnstable High School, Hyannis and has been an Adjunct Instructor of Art Education for the University of Massachusetts, Dartmouth. The students' work will be on display through April 12th. Works will be displayed in both the Town Hall Hearing Room and the Selectmen's Conference Room.

The advanced art students have taken art each year of their high school career. Many are planning to major in the visual arts in college and have already been accepted into distinguished colleges. The display will range from acrylic and oil paintings to pencil and pastel drawings.

Recently Mr. Lopes' art students completed "The Memory Project" which delivered 43 individual portraits of orphaned children in Vietnam. The Town of Barnstable's Growth Management Department will conduct a public hearing **Wednesday, March 6, 2013, at 3:00 pm in the Selectmen's Conference Room, 367 Main Street, 2nd Floor, Hyannis, MA 02601**. This location is handicap accessible. The purpose of the hearing is to obtain the comments and views of residents, public agencies, community organizations, and other interested parties in Barnstable on the priorities for the 2013 Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) program. Information obtained will be considered in the preparation of the draft 2013 One-Year Action Plan (July 1, 2013 – June 30, 2014). The plan serves as planning and strategic document for the Town's CDBG Program, which is funded by the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD).

Estimated 2013 Allocation for the CDBG Program is \$250,000 (9% reduction from PY 2012). A Note From the Town Collector's Office:

Just a friendly reminder that the third quarter real estate taxes were due back on February 1st and if not paid by that date, interest would begin to accrue the day after the due date. The fourth quarter of the FY2013 real estate will be due on May 1st.

The first and largest commitment of 2013 Motor Vehicle Excise Tax bills were issued on February 6, 2013 and will be due on March 8, 2013. Once again, I would like to remind you that once a bill is issued, you must pay the bill or the bill must be abated as no bill just goes away. Please don't get caught up in paying additional fees and jeopardizing your driver's license! There are also a few 2010, 2011 and 2012 Motor Vehicle Excise Tax bills being issued at the same time, which are delayed commitments from the Registry of Motor Vehicles.

The third quarter commitment of Utility Billing (sewer bills) was issued on February 26, 2013 and will be due on March 28, 2013.

The five Fire Districts of the Town of Barnstable offer the following information:



The Right Seat

Knowledge is power. Learn more to protect your child from injury and death in a crash.

GET HELP: Certified child passenger safety technicians are available to help you find the right car seat for your child's age and size. Please contact your local fire department to schedule an installation.



Birth - 12 month

Your child under age 1 should always ride in a rear-facing car seat.

There are different types of rear-facing car seats: Infant-only seats can only be used rear-facing. Convertible and 3-in-1 car seats typically have higher height and weight limits for the rear-facing position, allowing you to keep your child rear-facing for a longer period of time.

1 - 3 year

Keep your child rear-facing as long as possible. It's the best way to keep him or her safe. Your child should remain in a rear-facing car seat until he or she reaches the top height or weight limit allowed by your car seat's manufacturer. Once your child outgrows the rear-facing car seat, your child is ready to travel in a forward-facing car seat with a harness.

4 - 7 year

Keep your child in a forward-facing car seat with a harness until he or she reaches the top height or weight limit allowed by your car seat's manufacturer. Once your child outgrows the forward-facing car seat with a harness, it's time to travel in a booster seat, but still in the back seat.

8 - 12 year

Keep your child in a booster seat until he or she is big enough to fit in a seat belt properly. For a seat belt to fit properly the lap belt must lie snugly across the upper thighs, not the stomach. The shoulder belt should lie snug across the shoulder and chest and not cross the neck or face. Remember: your child should still ride in the back seat because it's safer there.
