I OPENING OF MEETING FOLLOWED IMMEDIATELY BY EXECUTIVE SESSION

The meeting was held in the Hearing Room, Barnstable Town Hall, Hyannis, MA.

Executive Session

A motion was made to enter executive session to discuss pending litigation.

III MINUTES FOR APPROVAL

A motion was made to approve the above minutes.

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IV REQUESTS FOR DETERMINATION

William I. Ross. Construct free-standing deck (12' x 16' platform) in front of cottage secured with footings; will have a nautical appearance, require low maintenance, and will be set away from foot/vehicle traffic flow at 1006 Craigville Beach Rd., Unit #1, Centerville as shown on Assessors Map 226 Parcel 004 CND. **DA-07043** The applicant attended.

Issues discussed: None

A motion was made to issue a negative determination.

Seconded and voted unanimously.

Champa, Michael A. & Maureen O. Construct in-ground pool and associated patio at 239 Eel River Rd, Osterville as shown on Assessors Map 115 Parcel 006. **DA-07044**

The applicant was represented by John O'Dea, E.I.T.

Issues discussed:

Shifting the project footprint and work-limit line so that existing specimen trees can be preserved.

A motion was made to issue a negative determination.

Dwight, Ogden, & David Miller. Repair existing foundation footing and replace 4 deck supports with 7 to improve safety and stability of existing deck; no change in gross footprint at 803 South Main St., Centerville as shown on Assessors Map 185 Parcel 016. **SE3-4638**

The applicant was represented by Peter Sullivan, P.E.

- Need for drywells for roof run-off
- Removing creosote piling
- Keeping the work barge from grounding out
- A work protocol for staff's advance review

A motion was made to approve the project with special conditions.

Seconded and voted unanimously.

Richard & Shawna Moos. Remodel home, and construct shed in buffer zone of inland bank at 23 Piney Point Dr., Centerville as shown on Assessors Map 228 Parcel 154. **SE3-4644**

The applicant was represented by Robb Sykes, P.L.S. Mrs. Moos also attended.

Issues discussed:

- Elevation view
- Buffer zone mitigation
- Accommodation of roof run-off

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• Delineating the future "no-mow" zone

(Moos, cont'd.)

A motion was made to approve the project with special conditions.

Seconded and voted unanimously.

The Steamship Authority. Reconstruct Slip #2 and construct fast-ferry berth. Project will realign Slip #2 to lie parallel to Slip #1, allowing room for fast-ferry to dock along northwest coastal bank. Parking lot changes on west side of terminal will be made for fast-ferry traffic circulation at 71 South St., Hyannis as shown on Assessors Map 326 Parcel 130. **SE3-4642**

The applicant was represented by Wayne Lampson, General Manager, and Bill Cloutier, Facilitating Engineer.

Issues discussed:

- Commissioner Lee recused himself, due to a business relation with the applicant.
- Need for a future Steamship Authority boat pump-out.
- Timing of work
- Appearance of the passenger shed
- No new hardscape obviating the need for new drainage infiltration

A motion was made to approve the project with special conditions.

Seconded and voted unanimously.

James P. Mills, Jr. Maintenance dredging with beneficial reuse on Dead Neck, and proposed modifications to existing licensed pier at 1 Indian Trail, Osterville as shown on Assessors Map 090 Parcel 001. **SE3-4643**

The applicant was represented by Peter Sullivan, P.E.

Issues discussed:

- 12-inch-wide props required
- Stops on all floats
- Revised plan showing additional piles necessary for float stops
- Removing lead caps
- Sharing pier utilities on plan

A motion was made to approve the project with special conditions.

Seconded and voted unanimously.

Carol Bendetson. Plant indigenous shrubbery and trees, and remove invasive exotic plants as a mitigation project at 246 Ocean View Ave., Cotuit as shown on Assessors Map 033 Parcel 003-001. **SE3-**

Via letter, a continuance was requested.

A motion was made to continue the project until August 14, 2007.

Seconded and voted unanimously.

No testimony was taken.

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VI CONTINUANCES

Francis M. & Eileen M. Ward. Construct stone wall to protect toe of coastal bank at 193 & 201 Bridge St., Osterville as shown on Assessors Map 093 Parcels 036-003 & 036-004. **SE3-4829**

The applicant was represented by John O'Dea, E.I.T. and Peter Sullivan, P.E.

Issues discussed:

- The bank as vertical buffer vs. sediment source to a beach dune or barrier beach
- The eroded sand ending up in the adjacent channel, rather than accreting on beaches or dunes
- The best design: whether sloping rock vs. vertical sheating
- Whether a wall is really warranted, given the rate of erosion
- A scaling-back of the running length of the project
- Armoring only the more vertical faces, rather than the whole reach of shoreline.

A motion was made to continue the project until August 14, 2007.

Seconded and voted unanimously.

Frank & Nancy Selldorff. Amend permit ART-0166 to expand project footprint as follows: demolish and rebuild single-family dwelling; upgrade utilities, construct pool and pool house and all associated appurtenances at 102 Bluff Point Dr., Cotuit as shown on Assessors Map 034 Parcel 071. **ART-0166**

The applicant was represented by Peter Sullivan, P.E.

Issues discussed:

Mr. Sullivan reported that the parties were very close to agreement. He requested a continuance.

A motion was made to continue the project until August 14, 2007.

Seconded and voted unanimously. John Abodeely abstained, as he was not on the quorum.

No testimony was taken.

A motion was made to support the proposed self-help application to acquire the subject parcel.
