The Commission listened to the ideas that Donna had for the use of the money. They supported her ideas and approved the idea of taking the wish list back to the Garden Committee.

Ideas included new benches, a compost bin, posts for bluebird boxes, adding additional plots, and winterizing the irrigation system.

B. SOC appeal SE3-4849

A request for adjudicatory review of the DEP Superseding Order was filed by an abutter of the proposed Hudock addition project, 97 Southgate Dr., Hyannis. The Superseding Order was an affirmation of the Conservation Commission approval of the project.
