#### I OLD & NEW BUSINESS

A. Ken Wagner update re: Hamblin and Lovell's ponds. Darcy Karle update re: Long Pond, Centerville, Mystic Lake, Middle Pond and Lake Wequaquet and Bearse"s Pond.

Ken Wagner, Manager of Water Resource Services, gave a PowerPoint presentation on prior alum treatments in Hamblin and Lovell's Ponds and Mystic Lake.

Ms. Karle gave an overview of four other lake and pond projects, and their compliance with special conditions.

B. Zelman SE3-5398 addition to garage; landscaping; change parking; relocate fence

133 Sunset Ln., Barnstable fence

At the Chair's request, Mr. Wilson was asked to indicate on the plan that the path is to be four-feet wide, and to initial.

A motion was made to approve the revised plan with special conditions: deck improvement approved as handicap-access improvement for as long as a demonstrated need exists, or until such time as the property is sold or transferred.

H. Wilkens SE3-4396 maintenance dredging allow re-use of dredge spoil 265 Seapuit River Rd., Osterville

A motion was made to approve a three-year extension: a mitigation progress report to be submitted to the Commission after the first year documenting mitigation survival rate, due in July, 2017.

## IV ENFORCEMENT ORDERS

A. **Taylor – 2 Crossway Pl., Osterville.** Alteration of a resource area, cutting vegetation in the 50' undisturbed buffer from a wetland, Coleman Pond. Cutting down large hardwood trees.

Mr. Taylor is required to have an arborist work with staff to train individual tree sprouts to grow into a structurally sound trunk. Must submit vegetation management plan and three-year monitoring reports. Allowed to prevent growth of invasives.

A motion was made to approve the enforcement order, as amended.

Seconded and voted unanimously.

B. Couite – 0 Fairway St., Centerville. Alteration of a resource area (coastal dune) on Nantucket Sound, by placing a large bench on dunes.

Ann Couite attended the meeting.

C. **Redden – 172 Ralyn Rd., Cotuit.** Alteration of a resource area, and alteration of the 50' undisturbed buffer from a wetland, No Bottom Pond, by removing vegetation.

**William LaPoint.** Demolish existing dwelling; construct new dwelling, pool, & septic system. Remove invasive plants and conduct mitigation planting at 980 Main Street, Cotuit as shown on Assessor's Map 034 Parcel 033. **SE3-5401** 

The applicant was represented by was represented by Daniel Ojala, P.E. of Down Cape Engineering, Jen Crawford and Nick Cranford of Crawford Land Management.

### Issues discussed:

- Verification of an eight-foot buffer strip, as required in a prior order of conditions; if it were improved upon, could this area be included in the overall mitigation calculation for this project?
- Request to see more vertical complexity of vegetation on bank planting plan
- Question about boat attached to the bulkhead
- Lounge beach chairs lined up on top of bulkhead where beach grass was to be maintained.

A motion was made to continue the project to August 9<sup>th</sup>.
