SUBJECT: Amendment of the Zoning Map to Extend HB Highway Business District to include

Parcel 254015 addressed as 10 Attucks Lane

BACKGROUND: This zoning map amendment will extend the Highway Business Zoning District to encompass this final parcel of land now zoned residential but developed and used commercially through use variances. Use variances are now prohibited within 300 feet of Route 132 severely limiting reuse thereby making private sector investment difficult.

ANALYSIS: The parcel to be rezoned, 10 Attucks Lane, Barnstable, MA (Assessor's Map 254 parcel 015), is 3.18 acres abutting the Hyannis Golf Course, Iyannough Road, and Attucks Lane. Presently this parcel is zoned Residence F-1.

RATIONALE: Highway Business zoning allows banks, not including drive-through banking, and professional offices as-of-right. Banks with drive through windows and other commercial uses are allowed by special permit from the Zoning Board of Appeals. Allowing business uses as-of-right with the option for a special permit for other commercial uses encourages redevelopment and reinvestment while the existing use variance prohibition and residential zoning do not offer that same option.

ORDERED: Section 1

That Chapter 240, Article III §240-21 "B, BA and UB Business Districts" of the Zoning Ordinance is hereby amended by adding the following new §240-21 A. (9) (j):

- (j) Multifamily dwellings (apartments) for Active Adult or Assisted Living located in the IND District, where the project includes a total project land area of 24 acres or more and is subject to a Senior Continuing Care Retirement Community Overlay District (SCCRCOD) (§240-29), the following regulations shall apply in lieu of all other bulk and dimensional, parking, landscaping, screening, and setbacks as may otherwise be applicable, and which shall apply to the entire project land area as if it were one lot, even though it may be comprised of more than one lot, which lots may be separated by a street or way:
 - [1] Minimum total project land area of 24 acres, including therein any streets or ways
 - [2] Minimum project land area ratio shall be 3000 square feet of project land area per each dwelling unit
 - [3] Maximum building height shall be 60 feet/5 stories
 - [4] Minimum front yard setback: 30 feet
 - [5] Landscape buffers (driveways, signage, lighting and walkways excepted):
 - (a) Front yard: 20 feet
 - (b) Side and rear yard: 10 feet
 - [6] Parking
- (a) For Active Adult dwelling units, off-street parking shall be provided at a ratio of 0.75 resident spaces per dwelling unit, 0.5 guest spaces per dwelling unit, and 0.75 employee spaces per 5 dwelling units;
- (b) For Assisted Living dwelling units, off-street parking shall be provided at a ratio of 0.5 resident spaces per dwelling unit, 0.5 guest

spaces per dwelling unit, and 0.75 employee spaces per 5 dwelling units

[7] To the extent a project developed pursuant to this Section §240-21 A.(9)(j) is also subject to the Groundwater Protection Overlay District regulations set forth in Section 240-35, the lot coverage and site clearing requirements of such Section 240-35 shall be calculated using the entire project land area as described in this section. All allowed impervious area may be located on an individual lot within the project land area, provided the impervious area requirements are met over the entire project land area.

Section 2 That Chapter 240, Article XI (Growth Management), §240-116 (Exemptions) of the Zoning Ordinance is hereby amended by adding the following new §240-116.D and renumbering the subsequent sections as appropriate:

D. Multifamily dwellings (apartments) for Active Adult or Assisted Living created under Section 240-21 A. (9) (j) of the Code of the Town of Barnstable;

Section 3 That Chapter 240, Article XIII §240-128 "Definitions" of the Zoning Ordinance is hereby amended by adding the following definitions:

Active Adult dwelling – an attached dwelling unit (apartment) intended and operated for occupancy by persons 55 years of age or older in which at least eighty percent (80%) of the occupied units are occupied by at least one person who is 55 years of age or older in accordance with applicable requirements of federal and Massachusetts law.

Assisted Living dwelling – an attached dwelling unit (apartment) in which supportive services are offered for individuals who need assistance in activities of daily living

include Active Adult Dwellings and Assisted Living Dwellings.

BACKGROUND: This ordinance amendment is brought forward in response to the needs of the Town's residents to have access to legally age-restricted housing that is designed to provide appropriate amenities and services. This amendment allows for the construction of independent living and assisted living facilities designed for persons 55 years of age or older, by reducing bulk and dimensional limitations that would otherwise be applicable in the Industrial District. These regulations will enable development of such facilities at an appropriate density, and in appropriate phases, to address demand as it arises. All areas within the Industrial District have access to the municipal wastewater plant, which allows for increased density, without significant impact on the Town's groundwater resources. The intensity and height standards will also encourage a more compact design in the Industrial District, allowing for the creation and preservation of additional open space on site.

Up Generator in the Airfield Lighting Vault at the Airport

BACKGROUND: Runway 15-33 is one of Barnstable Municipal Airport's (HYA) main runways. The main portion of the runway was last rehabilitated in 1985 and Runway 15 was extended in 1989. The pavement condition is listed as fair, soon to be poor. Part of this project will reconstruct Taxiways A and A1 (up to the runway hold lines) to meet current FAA advisory circular design requirements. The holding side of these taxiway stubs was updated during the Taxiway A reconstruction project in 2013.

A portion of Taxiway B east of Runway 15-33 will be realigned. The existing HYA Operations and ARFF building penetrates the Taxiway Object Free Area (TOFA) for Group-III aircraft. Approximately 700ft of Taxiway B from runway 15-33 to the east ramp will be realigned placing the building outside of the TOFA.

Taxiway C is over thirty (30) years old and has exceeded its pavement life expectancy. A portion of Taxiway C was reconstructed in 2015. Taxiway C between Taxiway D and Taxiway A will be reconstructed and realigned to meet current FAA Advisory Circular (A/C) requirements.

The existing Runway 15-33 Visual Approach Slope Indicator (VASI) will be removed and a new FAA owned and operated Precision Approach Path Indicator (PAPI) will be installed in its place to improve operations and flight safety.

The existing emergency back-up generator in the airfield lighting vault is over thirty (30) years old and is due for replacement and will be incorporated within this project.

This project is also a part of the Federal Aviation Administration's (FAA) goals to improve and correct airport layout deficiencies, enhance aircraft safety, and insure compliance with regulatory guidance. It will correct flight safety and aircraft separation concerns and keep the airport in compliance with FAA Part 139 certification requirements, and will provide a much needed rehabilitation of one of our two runways.

The following two prior Appropriation Orders were combined into one overall project by the FAA and the MassDOT Aeronautics Division, and are included in the total project costs. A.O. #2014-085 in the amount of \$400,000.00 was approved on May 15, 2014 for the purposes of funding preliminary design and permitting costs for this project; and A.O. #2015-124 in the amount of \$90,000.00 was approved on May 21, 2015 for the purpose of funding the replacement of the existing airfield lighting vault emergency generator and removal of its underground diesel fuel tank.

After submitting this capital project for final funding, a runway topographical survey was completed that revealed the need for additional earthwork to be FAA compliant with taxiway and

runway elevations. We had to adjust the height of the runway and portions of the surrounding topography several feet in certain locations, requiring the removal of an additional 90,000 cubic yards of dirt that was not included in the original design and cost estimates.

The Town Council approved A.O. #2016-090 on April 7, 2016 for this project in the amount of \$6,373,000 based upon an engineering construction estimate at the time of CIP submittal, and based upon preliminary engineering designs for the project and recent bid history for three other major reconstruction projects at the airport. During the Town Council meeting I asked that the Appropriation Order be approved as submitted, rather than cancel all bids, face the potential of higher bids on a subsequent rebid, and due to a shortage in FAA discretionary funds, we would risk losing FAA funding; and since we did not have sufficient time to seek an increase in funds prior to the Town Council meeting on April 7, 2016. We are submitting this request for additional funds in the amount of \$645,090.00 to complete the project.

The Barnstable Municipal Airport Commission (BMAC) contracted with Jacobs Engineering Group, Inc. (Jacobs) for the purpose of designing the project. The design was put out to bid with bid opening on April 28, 2016. The FAA Grant process requires the submittal of the grant application by May 2, 2016. The Town received two (2) construction bids, with the apparent low bidder being Lawrence-Lynch Corporation, based in Falmouth, Massachusetts in the amount of \$6,591,271.40. With this bid, the revised total project cost had to be revised to \$7,290,090.00.

ANALYSIS: Reasons for the cost escalation are attributed primarily to the additional unforeseen need to remove an additional 90,000 cubic yards of earth at the airport to be FAA compliant and to ensure that the runway elevation is higher than the taxiway. The bid prices of the apparent low bidder are \$350,218.60 below the revised engineering estimates; and are \$3,732,945.20 below the second bidder's price. The apparent low bidder's price for the removal of the extra earth work was \$1,170,000.00.

In addition, accepted Bid Alternate Number 1 provides for the use of a new pavement sealer (P608) that may extend the life of the pavement out to 30 to 40 years instead of the normal 20 year life expectancy.

Accepted Bid Alternate Number 2 is the cost of a second work shift for construction phases 6, 7, and 8 that will shorten the closure of Runway 15-33 by 40 to 50 days. If this extra cost is accepted as an "eligible" cost by the FAA and sufficient discretionary funds are available, then the Airport's costs and the cost of this appropriation order may be lowered by \$218,000.00. This will reduce the requested appropriation order to \$427,090.00.

The request for additional funds should be sufficient to complete the entire project. See the below table for a recap of the funding.

FISCAL IMPACT: This project is eligible for both FAA funding at a 90% reimbursement rate and MASSDOT AD funding assistance at a 5% reimbursement rate.

TOWN MANAGER RECOMMENDATION: The Town Manager recommends approval of this appropriation order.

BOARD AND COMMISSION ACTION: The Barnstable Municipal Airport Commission Finance Subcommittee is expected to approve this request on May 4, 2016.

BACKGROUND: During the snow storm of February 5-8, 2016 operation of snow removal equipment damaged three of the four Airport Runway 33 Visual Approach Slope Indicator (VASI) structures.

Given the nature and location of the strike, electrical damage occurred to the PAPI (Precision Approach path Indicator), vehicle security gates, security lighting, Airfield Ramp Lights, the Terminal and Tower buildings. As the Airport needs to adhere to Federal Security standards, the repairs and replacement of equipment needed to be completed immediately. Twenty-six Thousand Nine Hundred Seventy-nine Dollars and thirteen cents (\$26,979.13) was expended out of the Fiscal Year 2016 Airport Operating Budget funds to pay for emergency repairs to vehicle security gates F & E, seven security lighting poles, the Tower DVD, the PAPI lights, and the terminal.

ANALYSIS: When the Town of Barnstable suffers a covered property loss and the insurance settlement exceeds Twenty Thousand Dollars (\$20,000.00) the Town Council needs to appropriate that loss recovery, per the Massachusetts General Law Chapter 44 section 53 and compliance with our Insurance and Risk Management Procedures. The Town policy has a Five Thousand Dollar (\$5,000.00) deductible which the Airport will absorb out of the Fiscal Year 2016 Operating Budget. A check was received by the Town of Barnstable Purchasing Department in the amount of \$21,979.13 and was paid over to a holding account until the funds could be appropriated by the Town Council.

FISCAL IMPACT: This appropriation of funds to reimburse the Fiscal Year 2016 Airport Operating Budget is necessary for the continuing maintenance of the Airport. Due to increased costs and excessive storm related issues, the budget is already taxed to capacity. The impact of not appropriating these funds could affect the necessary operations at the Airport to prepare for the upcoming spring and summer season.

TOWN MANAGER RECOMMENDATION: The Town Manager recommends approval of this appropriation order.
