

### TOWN COUNCIL MEETING AGENDA October 18, 2012

quorum being duly present, Council President Frederick Chirigotis called the October 18, 2012 Regular Town Council meeting to order at 7:00 p.m. in the Hearing Room of Town Hall, 367 Main St., Hyannis, MA.

The Pledge of Allegiance was led by President Chirigotis, followed by a Moment of Silence.

## Wastewater follow-up—Cape Cod Water Protection Collaborative Executive Director Andrew Gottlieb

(See two handouts attached) – Ex. Director Gottlieb presented an update on the county work regarding the Wastewater Management issue.

### Highlights:

- The charge of the county role
- County's record in supporting local wastewater efforts
- Challenges
  - o Prop 2 ½
  - Inter-municipal cooperation
  - Resource constraints
  - Regulatory constraints
- Direction for Final Recommendation
- Summary of Initial Recommendations
  - County builds upon but doesn't supplant local initiatives
  - County role should facilitate local discussions to identify solutions for environmental protection

Asst. Town Manager Mark Ells said he is the representative to the Wastewater Collaborative. He would like feedback from the Councilors to take back to the governing board. They are preparing a comprehensive water management plan. The CAC is working on it. Phil Boudreau of the CAC will give an update in December.

Councilors: Dagwan, Daley, Canedy, Chirigotis, Rapp Grassetti and Cullum discussed:

 Possible EPA watershed grant. Gottlieb said the county may look at engineering for Barnstable and Yarmouth issue – he is not sure of grant.

- o Districts? The county will not recommend any free standing taxing authority. The county cannot create a district or operate any facility.
- Communication is important. Suggested the county inform the councilors so they can inform their constituents of local meetings; send info to Council office and they will disburse it.
- Upcoming conference in Hyannis dealing with this issue and Asst. Manager Ells will attend.
- County not associated with any emails on wastewater.

### **Health Insurance Update**

Town Manager Thomas Lynch introduced: Deborah Blanchette, Mark Milne, William Cole Lynch noted the health plan design change in spring where questions were raised and the town's commitment to come back with possible solutions for a better program

He introduced Longfellow Benefits Principal Pat Haraden, a Principal in the company, who and does not have any association with any health care providers. Haraden made the presentation.

#### **Process**

- Evaluated financial participation last 3 years
- o Benefits of being in CCMHG talked to departments & carriers
- o Analyzed
- Looked at other groups and stand alone programs
- Town has been in CCMHG since 1987 –
- He reviewed current enrollment
- CCMHG paid out more in claims than they collected from us
- CCMHG also provided other benefits from My Medication Advisor Program, etc.
- Looked at claim dollars and 56.9% of dollars were paid to Cape Cod Healthcare.
- Reviewed alternatives GIC had savings others did not
- GIC had no Blue Cross plans is looking into possibly adding them but not sure if they
  will and costs involved. would cost more if people utilized Cape Cod Healthcare;

Summarize – town getting \$3.7 - \$4.7 M financial benefit by staying with CCMHG.

Alternative groups would cost more

Councilors: Rugo, Tinsley, Rapp Grassetti, Canedy questioned:

- Comparison of costs by town. Town contributes 50%. Brewster 75%, Chatham 70%, Dennis 60%, Falmouth 50%, 50% and 75%, Sandwich 75%, Yarmouth 50%, with teachers receiving 60%.
- Why do employees have to have proof of spouse and dependents? Dependent audit
  is ordered by State law. You have to prove your dependents to make sure that all are
  qualified to be on the insurance policy.
- o What is the cost to the town for every 10% increase \$1.3 \$1.4 million?
- Suggestions to help employees with increased costs. Bill Cole, HR Director –
  negotiated with employees mitigation funds the money will be given to the
  employees impacted by the change. Suggestion utilize flexible spending account. –
  preventive services have no co-pays. Use Medication Advisor
- Possible work to be done between CCMHG and Cape Cod Healthcare to bring down costs of services
- Cost for just teachers to get 60 %

President Chirigotis made the meeting announcement for the broadcast by Channel 18 and asked if anyone was taping the meeting.

#### **PUBLIC COMMENT**

Milton Berglund – talked about the 5 ordinances that are coming before the council and are to be referred, specifically the rental properties; (more single family homes being used, overcrowded, noise, lack of maintenance, property values going down). Ordinances are to plug loopholes. Recoup cost of repeated police calls to properties.

John Crowe worked on a task force, lives off Main St. in Osterville. can't enjoy his property. Adjacent properties include a party house and career criminal. Over 300 people have "had" it. Please take these seriously...we are not targeting the average citizens.

Elizabeth Wurfbein is excited about the new ordinances and adjustments – feels it would benefit the town. The Chamber supports the changes. The BID district supports the National Geographic Pirate Museum possibility for the Armory. It is private investment.

Meg Loughran stated that the Centerville Civic Association supports the ordinance changes.

#### **COUNCIL RESPONSE TO PUBLIC COMMENT**

Councilor Canedy wants to have a broader council discussion on the Armory. Manager Lynch is getting ready for an RFP so that those interested can come back with their proposals. President Chirigotis cautioned that we have to be careful about playing our hand in public.

Councilor Cullum said downtown Main St is going forward - let's keep it rolling

Councilor Dagwan said she was pleased with the new ordinances. She knows many have problems with funds. Thanked the civic association and those who worked on it.

Councilor Cullum thanked as well.

# 2013-025 APPROVAL OF A CONSERVATION RESTRICTION IN WEST BARNSTABLE ON MAP 197, PARCEL 016 TO BARNSTABLE LAND TRUST, INC. – INTRO: 10-04-12, 10-18-12

Mark Robinson and Jackie Barton were present. Mark represented the Orenda Wildlife Land Trust and Jackie Barton was from the Barnstable Land Trust. He explained this parcel which is the site of the former West Barnstable brick factory.

Councilor Canedy and Daley:

 Questions tax impact and accessibility. This restriction makes no difference on the tax roles. There is a tax credit available to those who give it. It is accessible but not easily due to railroad track – but can be accessed by kayak. Upon motion duly made and seconded it was voted to move the question.

Mark Robinson explained the property – an island in Shallow Pond. This was sold and the seller will get a tax credit. They plan to allow access in small groups to certain areas.

Councilor Canedy and Joakim discussed:

 Access – will it be posted no trespassing? Access available through group visits. Not going to be posted
