

Town Council Meeting April 26, 2018



quorum being duly present, Council President Eric Steinhilber called the April 26, 2018, Town Council meeting to order at 7:00 p.m. in the Hearing Room of Town Hall, 367 Main St., Hyannis, MA.

PUBLIC COMMENT:

Peter Halesworth from Blish Point in Barnstable Village looking for a solution regarding the flooding that happened over the past few storms, this is impacting our homes. (Exhibit A)

Doug Payson regarding the flooding on Commerce Road as it becomes completely impassable. If there was an emergency, the safety personnel could not get to their houses. We need an escape route for the homes in that area.

Charlie Hetzel thanked the Barnstable Police officers for their professionalism, and empathy for the residents of Barnstable. The Peace Officers have assisted us on many occasions. They were everything and more that a citizen could hope for; throughout this time Chief MacDonald's door was always open. Thank you, God Bless you and May He keep you safe as you have kept us. [Trying this on a limited basis; see how it works; keep it controlled; about having liquor at the schools, I am not sure we can do that] Glad to see we are going to be a Housing Choice community, could we have the status on the HDIP to incentive market based housing [Will have Elizabeth Jenkins give an update at the next meeting] Kalmus Beach would be a perfect place to offer beer and wine license, as we have a seating area [we can have discussions about any and all of these] Water for Hyannis is monumental, fabulous effort and opportunity. We have gone the distance with Cape Wind, and now we have to look hard at Vineyard Wind. Fabulous report!

David Anthony, Director of Property and Risk Management gave an update of the Kmart Plaza and the tax possession property sale

Many people/staff have been working hard to bring this to fruition. We are advertising to as many different people as possible for the Kmart Plaza property. Current lease does not expire until 2024. We are familiar with the challenges with on line purchasing. Three documents:

- Request for proposal
- o Agreement while current lease is in effect
- New 49 year lease

We need to retain control with our zoning, but also the FAA requirements such as height regulations.

President Steinhilber thanked David Anthony and the entire Committee for all their efforts; this has been a topic of conversation for years; no other properties like it in the town.

Update on the Tax Possessions:

The plan is to sit down tomorrow to schedule Purchase and Sales agreements; held all the bids, waiting to roll out a plan. We have had some interesting issues, but we have worked through them at this point. These were the easy ones.

Councilor questions and comments;

What is the projected revenue [just over \$500,000 one-time cash sale, and expected tax revenue of approximately 10 to 12 thousand dollars] would you give us an update on properties that will be sold/purchased through the bids. We still have a housing issue here in town; hopefully some of these properties will include affordable housing units. [These particular properties are very small; in the next group of properties we may have more of an opportunity for housing].
