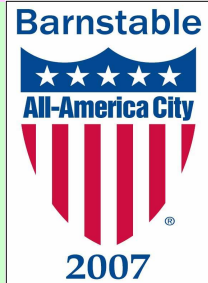

Dear Reader:

I hope this note finds you well and enjoying what's left of our Spring season. Our community just witnessed a Memorial Day weekend full of wonderful events honoring our veterans who have given so much to us and our Country.

Also at the May 17th Town Council meeting, Finance Director Mark Milne and I delivered the FY 2013 Budget Message to the Councilors with the theme of "Fiscal Stability in a Changing Environment." Despite the changing political environment, we have maintained our fiscal stability, achieved modest service enhancements, spent within our means and prudently planned our financial future. This message starts the public process with the Council as we work toward adoption of the budget. We will begin our formal budget hearings on June 7th. We have posted the entire budget on our website and placed a copy in all of our libraries for your review. We are committed to offering the highest quality of services within our budgetary constraints.

Naturally we continue to monitor the legislative action on the state budget. Any changes to either the House or the Senate budget could reduce local aid to the Town and schools. I am in close contact with our legislative delegation on these matters.

I am honored to have had the Town Councilors vote to offer me a two year contract through June 30, 2014. I am excited about this opportunity and appreciate the confidence the Councilors have in my ability to do the job. I want to thank those of you who have reached out with kind words of encouragement. I look forward to partnering with the Town Council to address the challenges we face and keep Barnstable moving forward.

**Summer is a time for school classrooms and hallways to empty
and the awaited anticipation of our children's fun and play time.**

Yet, emergency rooms across the country call summertime 'the trauma season for kids.'

From the heat to pools to bike riding, parents need to be on alert.

This summer children ages 14 and under will be rushed to emergency rooms nearly 3 million times for serious injuries resulting from motor vehicle crashes, drowning, bike crashes, pedestrian incidents, falls and other hazards. More than 2,500 children will die.

Tragedies rise and nearly half (40 percent) of all unintentional injury-related deaths occur during the summer months (May to August) because children are supervised less, have more free time and are involved in more outdoor activities. While you relax this summer, summer is not the time to relax about safety. Close supervision, proper protective gear, and other simple prevention steps will help keep your child safe.

Trauma is preventable. Keeping your children out of the emergency room takes thought and preparation.

Heat can kill. Children are smaller than adults and they dehydrate quicker. When kids play, they sweat. They should not be out in the heat for more than 30 minutes. Bring them inside for at least 15 minutes for water and snacks.

Insect Bites can be dangerous. Bugs also enjoy the outdoors. These creepy crawly, biting, stinging pests don't have to be such a pain if parents discourage children from getting excited and moving rapidly when they see insects - movement encourages insects to bite. Keep sugary foods and trash cans away from outside play and eating areas and avoid sweets during picnics - unless water is accessible to rinse off sticky areas after eating.

Sun Tips to Prevent Skin Cancer in Later Life. There are many steps you can take to reduce your child's exposure to the sun's rays. Sunscreens, wide brimmed hats, protective clothing and sun avoidance (between the hours of 10 a.m. and 4 p.m.) are important for maximum sun protection. Sunscreens should be viewed as a back-up to primary means of sun protection such as shirts, hats and sun avoidance. Always reapply sunscreen - even if it's waterproof - immediately after coming out of the water.

Making Telephone Communication Possible for Individuals with Hearing Loss & Speech Difficulties Jun 5 10-11 a.m. RSVP-Free The Outreach Project Manager for MassRelay will share information about free telephone relay services available through MassRelay that allow communication between individuals who are deaf, hard of hearing, deaf-blind or have difficulty speaking and standard telephone users. For example, Captioned Telephone is a service that is especially helpful to people who wear hearing aids or are hard of hearing and have difficulty hearing over the phone due to their hearing loss. Your Monthly Tip to Becoming a Better Consumer

June's Tip...Not Your Average Inspections

Weights & Measures Inspectors conduct inspections on a variety of devices throughout the year. The most frequent of the inspections are on 30 pound retail scales and retail motor fuel dispensers. However, during the summer months the inspectors will conduct inspections in the ten jurisdictions on certain measuring devices that usually go unseen by the general public.

Typically the Weights & Measures Department will inspect most marinas before July 4th to ensure that boaters and the marinas, are on a level playing field. In the summer of 2011 the department inspected and sealed 66 diesel and gasoline meters at 21 marinas within the ten jurisdictions. Of those 66 meters, 6 had to be adjusted to bring the meter back into tolerance. A majority of the marina meters are tested with a five (5) gallon-1155 cubic inches-test measure. The tolerance for this test is +/- six (6) cubic inches.

While at the marina, the cordage device, which is used to measure rope, or in the nautical sense, line, is also inspected to ensure the device is in compliance. The inspector will thread the line into the device and pull it through as the counter on the side measures feet and inches.

Package checking, which is also known as net weight, and tare inspections are conducted on different types of commodities at businesses large and small. During the summer months certain commodities such as ice and meat products are inspected to ensure that the tare is being taken so the gross weight is not being charged. The tare is the container or package which the product is packed and the customer should NOT be charged for the weight of the packaging. The Weights and Measures Department conducts these inspections year round, however, with the increased volume in business, the summer proves to be the time of year when errors may happen most often.

For you trivia buffs, the word **tare** can be traced through history. It is derived from the Arabic word, tarha. Tarha literally means, "that which is removed."

If you have any questions or concerns regarding the performance of a commercial weighing or measuring device used for trade, bring it to the attention of the merchant. If the problem is not resolved, contact the local Weights & Measures office for advice and/or assistance. The Barnstable Weights & Measures jurisdiction includes; Barnstable, Bourne, Brewster, Dennis, Harwich, Mashpee, Orleans, Sandwich and Yarmouth.

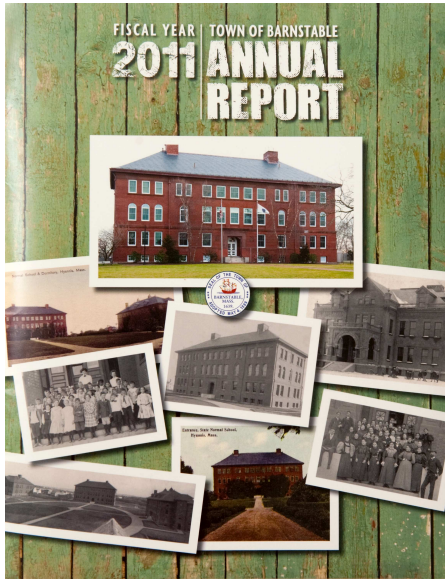
