MEETING MINUTES

Chair of Committee Councilor Jeffrey Mendes opened the meeting of the Appointments Committee in the Selectmen's Conference Room at 3:30pm and made the following announcement:

In accordance with Massachusetts General Laws Chapter 30A, Section 20, the Chair must inquire whether anyone else is recording this meeting and, if so, please make their presence known. The Administrator to the Town Council took Roll call, all members present in person at the start of the meeting with the exception of Councilor Terkelsen.

The Chair of Committee asked for public comment via the Zoom link provided to the Public.

Mr. Larry Morin (no comment, just listening)

Chair of the Committee welcomed Nancy Karlson-Lidman who is seeking the full member open position on Licensing. Ms. Lidman gave background information including the importance of hands-on experience, the policy-making process, and the implications of policies. She highlighted the need to consider all factors when opening a potential restaurant and discussed the issue of the appointment process, emphasizing that interest and readiness should not be the only criteria. Ms. Lidman stressed the importance of consensus in group decision making, the need for engagement and inclusivity, and the role of experience and knowledge in certain positions. She also touched on the structure of the board and the importance of collaboration and compromise among board members. Towards the end, she initiated a discussion about what constitutes success, emphasizing the importance of maintaining the town's natural beauty while adapting to change.

Committee members welcomed Natalie Pittenger. Ms. Pittinger was asked about consensus and why she would like to be on the Zoning Board. Councilor Bloom recused himself, as Ms. Pittinger worked on Councilor Blooms election run as a Councilor. (4:00pm)

Ms. Pittenger expressed her views on the importance of having knowledgeable people on committees to avoid unnecessary delays and decision mistakes. She shared her experiences with government processes, emphasizing that they can often be messy and in need of people who understand the ramifications. She also mentioned an upcoming opportunity for interviews to fill certain spots. Ms. Pittinger emphasized the importance of collaboration between technical analysts, users, and other relevant parties in establishing project specifications. She shared her personal experience growing up in

a coastal community and how it has influenced her perspective. Ms. Pittinger also discussed her ability to interpret regulations and apply common sense solutions to make the appeals and the board work together. She mentioned her attendance at Zoning Board meetings and her understanding of their structure.

Committee members asked about potential conflicts of interest and if recusal was a possibility if there was a conflict. Ms. Pittinger addressed potential conflicts of interest and suggested that disclosure and careful management could mitigate any issues. Towards the end of the meeting, she noted that her background is predominantly technical.

I was raised in a coastal town on the North Shore and have a heartfelt appreciation for the character and charm that exists in Barnstable. I would like nothing more than to join a committee responsible for

ensuring that that appeal remains consistent within the community.

My husband and I moved to Hyannis almost 15 years ago and have loved every minute of being here. My first exposure to zoning was when the neighborhood stopped the builder from changing the layout of a 40B development in my neighborhood. Thankfully the builder and his poorly designed effort failed. I also lead a group of neighbors to stop the clear cutting of an unspoiled lot which became the Tractor Supply store. We were not convinced that this store would benefit the neighborhood or help protect our ground water, especially given its location so close to the town's wastewater treatment plant.

Although my resume is largely technical, many of the same skills are applicable to interpreting zoning regulations. I do have the ability to provide fair and impartial responses as a result of reviewing plans and details that are submitted. During working years, problem solving was a key ingredient in keeping systems running consistently. Councilor Bloom came back into the meeting 4:24pm after the interview with Ms. Pittinger.

Committee members welcomed Thomas Keane and asked the same questions that were asked of the prior applicants.

Mr. Keane shared his professional background, <u>https://www.linkedin.com/in/tomkeaneboston/</u> which includes diverse roles in finance, operations, and politics. He served as a Boston city counselor for six years, representing a diverse district and emphasized the importance of understanding both sides of an issue and compromising to get things done. Mr. Keane mentioned his work as a writer for the Boston Globe and his political affiliation as a registered Democrat. He highlighted his involvement with the Cape Cod Foster Closet, a nonprofit that provides support to individuals raising someone else's biological children, often grandparents raising grandchildren. Mr. Keane explained that these individuals often face financial challenges and embarrassment, but the organization assists them without any income requirements or referrals. He also mentioned the organization's collaborations with other social service agencies to provide comprehensive support.

Committee members noticed he had three committees checked off and if he had a preference to which one he would like to be considered for, Mr. Keane left that up to the members of the Appointments Committee based on his discussions and resume.
