Commissioner John Abodeely was away, and Commissioners Peter Sampou and Scott Blazis were teaching. V OLD & NEW BUSINESS

A. John and Leslie Wilson – replanting plan review – Continued from Nov. 18, 2008 hearing

A motion was made to continue the hearing to February 10, 2009.

Seconded and voted unanimously.

B. Lori, Robert, and Nancy Parks – replanting plan review – (from Nov. 18, 2008 hearing)

Robert Parks and Ann Sheridan of Duxbury Gardeners attended the hearing.

The Conservation Agent reported that she went to the site and was able to squeeze in fourteen more trees.

A motion was made to approve the plan dated 1/7/09. Included, will be a five-year monitoring plan with reports to be submitted annually.

Seconded and voted unanimously.

C. Clarification on Sec. 702 schedule enforceability

The Commission concurred that the newly adopted shooting range schedule of operating hours shall be enforced via Chapter 702 of the Town Code, Sections 702-2 C I and Section 702-3.

D. Other

Staff announced new division operating procedures for processing Certificate of Compliance requests. Its purpose is to provide prompt execution of inspections, certificate issuance and, where warranted, remedial action where project corrections are needed.

The Commission expressed concern that the enforcement trigger be clear-cut.

Public Comment:

• Arlene Wilson requested that the applicant have the option of attending certificate of compliance site visits.

A motion was made to approve the certificate of compliance policy, pending its written submission and release to the Commission, consultants, and the public.
