Sandy Neck Board Meeting November 19, 2012

A regularly scheduled meeting of the Sandy Neck Board was held on November 19, 2012 at the Selectmen's Conference Room, 367 Main Street, Hyannis, MA. The meeting was called to order at 7:30 pm by Chairman Rich French.

Roll Call:

- Public: Wendy Paquette, Diane Lomba, Don Fillman, Milton Berglund, Steve Heslinga, Scott Morris, Laura Reckford (Barnstable Enterprise) and Ed Maroney (Barnstable Patriot).

Act on Minutes:

• On a **motion** by Nate King and seconded by Pete Sampou, the Sandy Neck Board voted to approve the October minutes as printed.

New Business:

Financial Director Mark Milne addressed the Board.

He reviewed the Sandy Neck Enterprise Fund and distributed a set of financial reports which is attached at the end of these minutes. See Attachment A.

Highlights:

- Good year for revenue in part because of limited closures and more beach activity.
- Positive revenue = good fiscal year.
- Completed payback for bathhouse plans now paying back note for bathhouse building.
- Free cash means free from all encumbrances not free to use. This money is surplus and available for appropriations and for any unanticipated expenses. This is a strong surplus but is needed because of the potential volatility at the beach. There is no time when there is a negative cash flow in this budget.
- In answer to the question about setting aside free cash, Mr. Milne stated that enterprise accounts are allowed to accumulate resources for capital expansions or improvements. But it is better to pay for it over time (maybe with a bond) why make the current users solely pay for future users.

New Business:

- Parking Plan proposal was discussed last month.
- 2013 User Fees was tabled.

New Business cont'd.:

Sandy Neck Year End Report

Nina Coleman addressed the Board.

She reviewed the entire report which is attached at the end of these minutes. See Attachment B. The parking numbers were also reviewed and are attached at the end. See Attachment C.

Highlights:

- Report with be presented to ConComm in December.
- Piping Plovers = terrible year for productivity mostly because of June storm and high level of fox predation.
- There is a fisher (sometimes referred to as a fisher cat) on beach.
- Good year for Diamondback terrapins.
- Less terns survived mostly lost from fox predation.
- Enforcement was up this year due to commitment to go after speeders and drinking. As a result there were more citations written, stickers were revoked and some people were no trespassed.
- No deer hunt this year (usually every other year). Currently pheasant season.
- Merchandise sales up again this year. Some shirts still left for purchase at gatehouse.
- Less escorts because most of the beach was open and because of the marsh trail repair allowing better use by cottage colony.
- ORV camping usage has increased.
- This year was an anomaly because all the other beaches were closed for most of the summer.

Staff Report:

Nina Coleman addressed the Board:

Gatehouse will close after Thanksgiving and hours by appointment only. Call Gatehouse and leave message.

This picture is a result of Hurricane Sandy. Water came up to bottom of dune but not over. Northeast storm the next week caused more damage — not heavy erosion at the dune — but did affect the elevation at the beach.





This is a 60 lb. Loggerhead Turtle that was rescued from the front beach. It was hit by a boat and lost it flipper. It was sent to the New England Aquarium for rehab. It is reportedly doing well

Also washed up on the beach and rescued during the storms were 8 Ridley Turtles and various seabirds (loons, razorbills, dovekeys, gannets).

Three more Ridley Turtles were rescued last week. They were cold stunned.

Public Comment:

• Milton. Berglund addressed the Board.

He believes there are too many ORV vehicles on Sandy Neck and that there should be a daily limit. He is a hiker and had a bad experience on a "high usage" day. He felt unwelcome trying to walk along the beach between the ORVs and the water. He also saw dogs running loose.

Board discussion:

- o There is no daily limit on the beach.
- This year was an anomaly.

- o Thank you for your comments regarding hikers we try to balance the different users at the beach.
- Don Fillman addressed the Board.

He understands the need for the parking plan when there are bird closures but he would not like to see the parking plan if there are not closures. He wants to park whenever he wants.

Board discussion:

- ORVs. Safety must be the top priority.
- There has to be areas that are day trippers only with no overnight parking. Those areas have portable toilets.
- After the beach opens parallel parking is allowed.

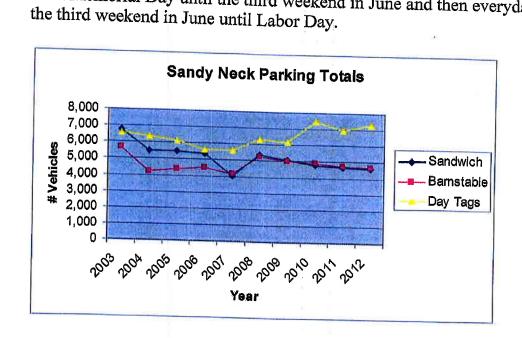

Good Day,

I would like to take this opportunity to address the board in the matter of the proposed Parking plan (restriction) of Sandy Neck Beach for 2013.

As a Sandy Neck permit holder since 1989, I am opposed to the proposal of extending the parking plan though the 2013 summer season, after the shorebirds have fledged. I spent weekends on Sandy Neck, after the parking plan was lifted in 2012, as I do not want to be told where and how to park while enjoying my experience and fishing on this beach. I observed no safety issues or concerns during this time, and feel the extending this parking restriction interferes with my enjoyment and access of Sandy Neck. I do not always park with a crowd, and park at different areas during my visits while enjoying my passion of surf fishing.

If the new parking plan worked for the Park during the shore bird nesting period, then fine, I am for keeping that in place, but only during that time. I would like to think my payments of my permit fees for two vehicles and occasional overnight fees for my chase allow for me to enjoy all the areas of Sandy Neck Beach, not just certain areas where under a season long parking plan I would be told where and how I can park on the Beach.

I hope the board looks into this proposed issue in length, and, if need be, be provided more feedback from the staff of what exactly was the problem on the beach after the parking plan was eased after the fledging of the shore birds.

I also have found that the area east of trail 6 that had been opened usually after Labor day for Orv fishing only, has not been allowed in the last two seasons, and I believe this was addressed in the issuance of the OOC some yrs back. This area is well established, is high, and Opening to ORV's for fishing should still be allowed.

As for raising Beach permit Fee's, If the board sees the need to raise beach permit fees, I would hope they step back and look at the user groups that utilize the services provided during the season, for the most part, SCV's do not need the use of the Sanitation devices, or Parking personnel, and the bath house as the ORV crowd does. But everyone does benefit from the air-up station and compressors that the park provides, and the cost of this should be borne by all groups. Overnight fees were raised on the SCV's the last yr. Daily fee's were done away with a period of time ago. I suggest that if the board sees the need to raise the fees, it be done across the board, and include raises in fees to all groups, Barnstable, Sandwich, and out of town stickers, and if need be, re institute the daily fee's for ORV's. I feel this would help in the overall income for this park and allow the staff the needs to keep operating this Beach and Park.

Thank you for allowing me to comment on these issues.

Dear Ms. Coleman:

After hiking on Sandy Neck on September 2, 2012, my wife and I resolved to write to you about the serious overcrowding of RVs along the Cape Cod Bay waterline. Our suggestion is to limit the number of vehicles allowed to enter the Sandy Neck reservation on any one day...first come/first serve basis, taking into account the number of vehicles already overnighting on the beach front. The congestion of RVs along the beach front has become seriously shocking to those who have been visiting Sandy Neck for many years...in our case since 1955.

The beach front looks tacky and degraded. The beach road is smoggy with gasoline fumes from the fairly constant flow of traffic. Bits of debris, mainly paper and plastics, are clearly visible. Dogs are supposed to be on a leash but this was not always the case. Several dogs with a leash on were allowed to run free, to our surprise. On Road 2 we observed one dog owner who walked his dog just over the hill but left the dog waste just lying in the sand on the road. He refused to pick up, or bury the waste claiming he "forgot" to bring a bag with him and would not use the cup in his hand for it.

This problem of over congestion has been growing for years but it has now reached the level where we seriously believe the Park Management has lost effective control over the area. Our understanding from a Park Ranger with whom we spoke is that once an RV owner has paid for the annual permit, there is no further restriction whatsoever on how many vehicles may enter the Beach front allowed for vehicles. This we submit is not good management of the local environment.

We do not suggest banning RVs...that would be wrong...but we do suggest establishing a daily usage limit. Please consider doing so,
