Councilor Discussion and Comment:

Would you distribute a copy of your presentation; an excellent concise and informative presentation; Are we obligated under a union contract, to license the employee? [Renewal is the obligation of the town] complaints regarding Princes Cove for a few slips that are not useable. Good job on taking care of the roads in a very severe winter; should continue to add to the up keep of the roads; how do we address the increase in overtime? [we are working hard using new technology to get the most out of the money available] it was a tough winter, very few complaints, things are getting done; sidewalks on Sea Street are narrow in places, sidewalk areas were dug up because the bucket was wider than the sidewalk. Pay as you throw, can you tell us about it? [Disposal costs will be rising, anticipate an increase in the sticker costs, one way to reduce costs is a pay as you throw plan] How do you see this working [sticker holders] there is a workshop scheduled for July 24th to discuss trash; recycling is low because Marstons Mills is so far away [we are looking at that option to have additional recycling locations] the selling of recycled materials brings in more money if the items are separated [we get quite a bit of income from metals, some of the items get hauled away for free, single stream would be better if we can continue having it hauled away for free] interested in the savings realized with the solar arrays; could we look at selling beach stickers at the transfer station. ["Net metering", we are limited to how much energy we can sell back to the grid] can we see more information on this in the future

Are you soliciting customer feedback; in addition to the card will it be on line [yes] will that be a part of a future presentation; is there a way to ask questions on line[yes] concern for the Bismore Park

parking area [reduce it to 6 hour limitation] thank you for your presentation; excited that you are tackling the special events permitting; septic issues have they been streamlined [yes, emergency procedures in place] problem properties ordinances, vacant and abandoned or foreclosed properties [problem properties under foreclosure; we have heard from half the banks; we do not know the banks on each of them, one inspector tracking these] six month review should be coming up, would like to keep on top of it; CFAC told us growth is flat; moving percentages of people around; [adjusting duties to utilize people more effectively] do you anticipate a leveling off; big money commercial growth [numbers are down, amount of construction is up for remodeling, construction value is up] need to expand our growth base; focus on customer service is moving in the right direction; consumer price disclosure [a new law passed this year, increased inspections of pricing of food items] in a few months can we have another presentation about the upgrades in customer service. As a homeowner is there a way to get inspections in the evening or weekends: [ves on an overtime basis] suggest try to offer nights and weekend inspections; consider folding Growth Management into Regulatory Services, to help streamline processes for the public; need more accuracy in our permitting; reach out to the Civic Association Presidents, with your model for special event planning; publicize your intent with a comment period; rental registrations, do we have a figure on that as a generator of funds [brings in over \$240,000 dollars, over 2,000 rentals] not sure if everyone knows that rentals are required to permit yearly; kiosks for the Ocean Street lot, when would that come on line? [Old machines are unusable, new machine is installed, not yet in use, phasing it in] People who live and working the area use that parking, are you going to limit the overnight parking [6 hours to pay to park, or an immediate abutter will have a sticker 20 minute parking on Main St [met with the BID to eliminate 20 minute parking Indian Pond issues we would like to have a discussion on another day:

Councilor Discussion and Comment:

Operating the shooting ranges is part of this budget, lost a FTE to offset the cost for someone to be at the shooting range have some excellent staff in this town, singled out, Charlie Lewis, Nina Coleman, Dan Horn and Eric Shufelt appreciates Town Manager for adding personnel to the harbor; [passionate staff, dealing with quality of life issues] on the subject of picnic table replacement, Keyes beach could use some picnic tables; [that is a high priority need] did we have a budget for the shooting range this past year? Do you think the shooting range will be open this year? It appears as though we are further away from having a shooting range;

A motion was made and duly seconded to withdraw the 54,000 for the shooting range from this budget.

Councilor Discussion and Comment on the proposed amendment:

What happens if we leave it in the budget and do not use it? [If we take it out of the budget, we will have to come back to the Council to appropriate the money. If the money is not spent it goes back to the general fund] Opposed to leaving it in the budget due to the many steps that have to be taken before we can use this property as a shooting range. Many residents have requested that we open the range pending the legislation; The budget is developed as a whole, these line items are just a description, if unanticipated monies are needed, the money could shift around; [divided internally] would not be in favor of this amendment; support the reopening of the shooting range, some of us have a commitment to move forward with the range, could not support the amendment; not making a statement, it still has a lot of discussion; would like some clarification of moving money around. [The bottom line is what we are held to] premature to appropriate the money.

Voting on the proposed amendment to withdraw the \$54,000 for the shooting range from this budget **VOTE: 3 in favor and 10 opposed (3 in favor-Canedy, Wallace, Hebert) Did Not Pass**
