RESOURCES FOR PARENTS

Cape Cod Children's Place: As a grassroots foundation, Cape Cod Children's Place develops free parent education programs and free playgroups promoting early literacy and community connections for isolated families. These programs are offered at other locations throughout the Lower and Outer Cape and are now reaching the Mid-Cape region. As community needs have evolved, CCCP has continued to develop new services to meet those needs, including programs to support families affected by substance use disorder and support groups for grandparents raising grandchildren.
