June 2025

June has arrived! June 20th will officially mark the beginning of summer. With summer comes an undying sense of adventure and a burning curiosity. During this time at Sandy Neck you'll see the Great Marsh gain a beautiful green vibrancy that stretches for miles. Hudsonia tomentosa, otherwise known as woolly beach heather, will bloom as blankets of yellow flowers casting a daytime glow across the vast landscape.

Diamondback Terrapins can be seen making their journey into the expansive network of dunes to lay their eggs before returning to the marsh to rest. Piping Plovers can be observed incubating their eggs along with their Least Tern neighbors. You'll also see whales return to Cape Cod Bay which can be seen offshore. Other wildlife such as Coyote, Fisher, Mink, Otter, and countless different species of birds can be seen while exploring. We recommend taking a scenic hike on the Sandy Neck property to enjoy all it has to offer. We also recommend taking a look at some of the public events we'll be having this month as they will provide you the opportunity to explore the property along with experts in the field and learn more about what makes Sandy Neck Beach Park a great summer destination.
