District Improvement Financing is a local tool that allows a municipality to identify and capture incremental tax revenues from new private investment in a specific area and direct them toward public improvements and economic development projects in the same area. DIF is not a new tax or special assessment, and it does not increase a municipality's tax rate.

This work is funded via a grant through MassDevelopment's Real Estate Technical Assistance Program to examine possible benefits of creating a District Improvement Financing Program for downtown Hyannis. Learn more <u>here</u>.



The Town of Barnstable will be hosting a second public meeting to help inform the creation of a Hyannis Harbor Master Plan at the 529 Main Street building in Hyannis on Tuesday, June 11th at 6:30pm.

Initial outreach meetings were held on December 13th to solicit feedback from the public on their vision for the future of the Hyannis Harbor area. Using feedback from those meetings and input from area stakeholders, along with a detailed analysis of the existing conditions of the area, the Town with their consultant team has developed initial harbor land use recommendations to be presented and discussed at the June 11th meeting.

Public participation is encouraged and pizza will be served.




