Barnstable, MA \$31,785,000 General Obligation Bonds Net 3.58%

(HYANNIS, MA – May 29, 2024) Sean O'Brien, Treasurer Collector, announced that the Town of Barnstable received competitive bids from bond underwriters on Wednesday, May 29, 2024, for a \$31,785,000, 20-year general obligation bond issue. KeyBanc Capital Markets was the winning bidder on the Bonds with an average interest rate of 3.58%. The Town received a total of 6 bids on the Bonds. Bond proceeds will be used to finance various municipal projects.

Prior to the sale, S&P Global Ratings, a municipal bond credit rating agency, affirmed the Town's 'AAA' bond rating, the highest rating attainable. The rating agency cited the Town's strong wealth and income indicators, comprehensive set of formalized financial policies and practices, history of strong financial performance with the maintenance of very strong reserves, low overall debt and contingent liability profile, and strong institutional framework as positive credit factors.

The bids for the Bonds were accepted at the offices of the Town of Barnstable's Municipal Advisor, Hilltop Securities Inc., at 54 Canal Street in Boston, Massachusetts.

THE TOWN OF BARNSTABLE WILL BE HOSTING A SECOND VIRTUAL PUBLIC MEETING ON TUESDAY, JUNE 11TH AT 5:00PM TO DISCUSS THE POSSIBLE CREATION OF A HYANNIS DISTRICT IMPROVEMENT FINANCING (DIF) PROGRAM.

The Town, along with its consultant Camoin Associates, will be presenting a draft Hyannis DIF Master Plan and will explain how the program could work in Barnstable.

District Improvement Financing is a local tool that allows a municipality to identify and capture incremental tax revenues from new private investment in a specific area and direct them toward public improvements and economic development projects in the same area. DIF is not a new tax or special assessment, and it does not increase a municipality's tax rate.

This work is funded via a grant through MassDevelopment's Real Estate Technical Assistance Program to examine possible benefits of creating a District Improvement Financing Program for downtown Hyannis. Learn more <u>here</u>.



The Town of Barnstable will be hosting a second public meeting to help inform the creation of a Hyannis Harbor Master Plan at the 529 Main Street building in Hyannis on Tuesday, June 11th at 6:30pm.

Initial outreach meetings were held on December 13th to solicit feedback from the public on their vision for the future of the Hyannis Harbor area. Using feedback from those meetings and input from area stakeholders, along with a detailed analysis of the existing conditions of the area, the Town with their consultant team has developed initial harbor land use recommendations to be presented and discussed at the June 11th meeting.

Public participation is encouraged and pizza will be served.
